Lucy McCrudden is Founder/CEO of Dance Mama™ CIC, advocating and celebrating professional dancing parents, highlighting their issues and providing inspiration, information and support. Lucy's 22-year career has dove-tailed her own work with key positions in learning and participation with world-class organisations including The Place and The Royal Opera House.

She has taught over 19,000 people and has engaged with a wide variety of cultural organisations in consulting, management, choreography and presenting/public speaking roles. An Ambassador for PiPA Campaign and Secretariat - Active Pregnancy Foundation's Scientific Advisory Board, she received an Honourable Mention for the inaugural AWA Woman in Dance Award, won One Dance UK's Change Maker Award 2022, in the same year she delivered her TEDx talk as she embarked on her PhD at Christ Church Canterbury University. In 2023 she co-Founded the AHRC-funded International Parenting and Dance Network and was shortlisted for *This Mum Moves* Ambassador of the Year.

ADAIRE TO DANCE

Adaire to Dance is a Midlands based company under the Artistic Direction of Alice Marshall.

Their aim is to create and perform work that will impress, captivate and entertain everyone from a dance enthusiast to a dance novice. The company works predominantly in a contemporary dance style with work spanning from humour, film and pure movement, giving a diverse insight into the world of contemporary dance.

THE GRAMOPHONES

The Gramophones are a playful, female theatre company, who devise honest theatre placing the audience at the centre of their performances. They use inventive storytelling, physical theatre, clowning, circus and autobiographical work to create accessible theatre.

They have been commissioned to make work by Derby Feste, Creative Arts East, First Art and Shire Hall Dorset. They have toured with various rural touring schemes and to small-scale theatre venues, receiving seven successful ACE Grants for the Arts Awards.



BOBAK CHAMPTON

Baba (dad) to Mina – age 3. Frustrated by media and public discourse Bobak is motivated to make work which changes the conversation on all things Middle Eastern. His work is "an antidote to the hateful anti-Muslim rhetoric spouted by the likes of Donald Trump", The Scotsman.
